THE INTERIM PASTOR'S MISSION MEMO - DECEMBER 2024

Christmas is a special time of year, when we celebrate the birth of our Savior. In the early centuries, the church had an annual observance of the death of Christ. Before the fourth century, Christians, observed "Epiphany", the manifestation of God to the world, celebrating Christ's baptism, His birth, and the visit of the Magi. (Churches in the East-Egypt, Asia Miner, and Antiach cantinued this



Asia Minor, and Antioch continued this celebration until today)


During the fourth century, controversies raged over the nature of Christ. The Council of Nicaea (325 AD) met to deal with a heresy which taught that Jesus was not truly God but only a good human teacher and led to an increased emphasis on the **doctrine of the incarnation, the affirmation that "the Word was made flesh" (John** 1:14). It is likely that the urgency to proclaim the incarnation was an important factor in the spread of the celebration of Christmas.

No evidence remains about the exact date of the birth of Christ. The December 25 date was chosen as much for practical reasons as for theological ones. Throughout the Roman Empire, various festivals were held in conjunction with the winter solstice. In Rome, the Feast of the Unconquerable Sun celebrated the beginning of the **return of the sun. The winter solstice seemed an appropriate time to celebrate Christ's** birth. Thus, in the Western Church the festival of the sun became a festival of **THE SON**, the Light of the world. Christmas, the name, a contraction of the term "Christ's mass," did not come into use until the Middle Ages.

Christmas is a time to pause and give thanks for the love, hope, and joy found in Jesus. Some say that Christmas is a celebration of God's imagination. Popular traditions include: Exchanging gifts, Decorating Christmas trees, Attending church, Sharing meals with family and friends, and Waiting for Santa Claus.

We celebrate Immanuel, which means "God with us" (Matthew 1:23), is another name for Jesus. His birth and life is a message of good news. It doesn't matter how hard or hopeless our situation may appear to be, God is there for us. We don't have to journey through our challenges and struggles alone. He understands them. He walks them alongside us. As we exchange gifts with loved ones, it is out of remembrance of the gift God gave us in Jesus. The gift that we are loved, are never alone and can have hope for the future.


Christmas Cookie Extravaganza – Sunday, December 15

Week 2 (Dec 4) Salt of the Earth: Jesus calls us to flavor the earth and to savor the good things that come from him through his birth.


Week 3 (Dec 11) Rock of Ages: Jesus is our rock, a solid foundation on which to build a life of joy.
